





Imagine walking in the footsteps of Jamie and Claire from *Outlander*, with a local guide regaling all the gruesome history and stories which inspired Diana Gabaldon. We take you on a journey to some of the most famous locations from the hit TV series, such as Midhope Castle, the real-life Lallybroch, Doune Castle, the seat of Clan MacKenzie, and the impressive Blackness Castle, the setting for Fort William. A splendid introduction to Scotland. This tour fuses the remarkable beauty of Loch Lomond and the Trossachs National Park with the majestic sight of the Kelpies and the savage history of Stirling Castle. On this trip there is plenty of time to examine amazing architecture and ponder over breathtaking natural and man-made wonders while immersing yourself in myths, legends and stories.

We depart Edinburgh and head west towards Falkirk where you get the chance to visit and marvel at the stunning Kelpies, the world's largest equine sculptures. Dedicated to the horse-powered heritage of Central Scotland, the Kelpies also celebrate the mythological transforming beasts living in our lochs, rivers and streams.

Our journey then takes us to the 'Bonnie

Join us on a day tour to a real Highland Games where you can soak up the atmosphere and experience the excitement. The Games, or Gatherings, take place in towns and villages throughout the country and are a highlight of the Scottish calendar, making for a truly memorable day out amongst grand Highland scenery.

The Highland Games are renowned over the world as a test of strength between Clans. These athletic contests date back over 900 years, and the Games are a fantastic spectacle where you'll see Highland dancing, pipe band displays, hammer throwing, tug-o-war and caber tossing.

We have created a range of day tours based around these spectacular cultural events that include the best of our beautiful landscape. Each has its own local charm and character. Our programme includes a visit to the world famous Braemar Gathering, attended by members of the Royal Family since Queen Victoria first attended in 1848.





BRAEMAR GATHERING

Known as 'The Games' and originating from those believed to have been held by Malcolm III in the 11th Century, an annual Highland Games Gathering is held at Braemar in Royal Deeside on the first Saturday in September. This Gathering is one of the most famous. Her Majesty, the late Queen Elizabeth II, was a patron and frequently attended.

Back in Edinburgh, you will have time to relax and explore the city before making your own way to the evening performance of the Military Tattoo at Edinburgh Castle.

Head to the north and west of Scotland to discover some of our country's most fascinating sights. Encounter iconic gems like beautiful Eilean Donan Castle, dramatic Glen Coe and famous Loch Ness, all part of the Highland's rich heritage and spellbinding beauty.

Combine a visit to the breathtaking Isle of Skye with whisky tasting and ancient myths and legends; an authentic Scottish experience not to be missed!

DAY ONE I We leave Scotland's capital behind and make our way through Macbeth country to Dunkeld with its mighty Cathedral. We'll visit a Highland whisky distillery to discover how Scotland's most famous drink is produced. Learn the true story which inspired *Outlander* at Culloden Battlefield and attempt your own journey through the stones at Clava Cairns. Meet the most amusing and inquisitive birds in Scotland, while exploring the stunning west coast, and the idyllic isles of Mull and Iona.

DAY ONE I Leaving Edinburgh, we journey west past the ancient city of Stirling towards the scenic beauty of Loch Lomond. Take photos from the Rest and Be Thankful viewpoint and enjoy free time in pretty Inveraray for lunch. Visit the ancient Dunadd Fort before continuing towards the bustling port town of Oban for our ferry to Mull, where we spend two nights in Tobermory. (Overnight: Tobermory)

DAY TWO I Sit back and relax on our water-based adventure around the beautiful Treshnish Isles. Throughout this extravaganza keep an eye out for dolphins, seals, eagles and whales, while listening to commentary from our wildlife guide. DAY THREE I Today we travel across mountainous Mull to visit the spiritual Isle of lona, often referred to as the sacred heart of Scotland. Enjoy plenty free time to have lunch, visit Iona Abbey and explore the white sand beaches. Afterwards, we catch the ferry back to Oban, where you can try fresh seafood and have a drink with the locals on our last night. (Overnight: Oban)

For our final stop we visit Dunkeld and take a walk through the quaint village on to the River Tay, and make a visit to the cathedral. We return to Edinburgh in the evening.



Our destination is the remote islands of Shetland for one of the most incredible festivals in Europe. On the last Tuesday of January this traditional winter festival marks the lengthening of the days and the dawn of another year. Classic Scottish dancing, traditional Shetland music, the boat burning ceremony and torchlight procession makes for an unforgettable experience.

DAY ONE I Leaving our capital city of Edinburgh, we stop to view the iconic Forth Bridge. We then travel on through the Kingdom of Fife with its stunning coastal scenery before stopping at the ancient university town of St Andrews. We then travel to Aberdeen via Dunnottar Castle, perched dramatically on the edge of the North Sea, and board the ferry for the overnight journey to the Shetland Islands. (Overnight: Ferry)

DAY TWO I After sailing into Lerwick we spend the morning enjoying the main town of Shetland including a visit to Clickimin Broch. After a visit to Scalloway Castle, we spend the rest of the afternoon exploring the islands of Burra and Trondra and the stunning Meal Beach before we return for a night out in the Shetland capital! (Overnight: Lerwick)

DAY THREE I After a leisurely start to the day we will make our way to the stunning

beach at St Ninians's Isle. We then visit Jarlshof, one of Scotland's finest prehistoric sites, before moving on to the stunning cliffs and sea views at Sumburgh in the far south of the island. We return to Lerwick to prepare for the main event with some celebrations in town with the locals. (Overnight: Lerwick)





We then visit the stunning peninsula of Lunna, before heading to Eshaness, known as the wild west of Shetland with spectacular coastal scenery. We'll return to Lerwick to board the overnight ferry back to Aberdeen. (Overnight: Ferry)

DAY SIX I We make our way through Royal Deeside and pass Crathie Kirk where the Royal Family worships when at their Highland residence. We will then have ample time to visit Braemar for lunch. Our return journey passes through the Cairngorm National Park and Royal Braemar before arriving back in Edinburgh.



DAY ONE I Leaving Edinburgh, we head to Perthshire, a land of forests, rivers and mountains. We visit Dunkeld with its historic cathedral. Our journey north takes us through the mountainous Cairngorms National Park and on to Culloden Battlefield and the standing stones of Clava Cairns. (Overnight: Inverness)

DAY TWO I We depart Inverness and head further north to join the spectacular North Coast 500 trail. Our first stop will be the fairytale Dunrobin Castle and a visit at a local whisky distillery before boarding the ferry to the Orkney Isles with the chance to spot dolphins, whales, and orcas.

(Overnight: Orkney Isles)

DAY THREE I We depart Kirkwall in the morning to explore some of Orkney's wonderous sites. First, we make a stop at the Italian Chapel, and will spend the rest of the day exploring Orkney's Neolithic history. Stops include Skara Brae, the towering Ring of Brodgar and The Stones of Stenness. (Overnight: Orkney Isles)

RESERVE AT TIME OF BOOKING

DAY FOUR I We catch the ferry back to the mainland to re-join the North Coast 500 trail. We make a stop at Smoo Cave, a spectacular sea cave set into the limestone cliffs of Sutherland. Driving west, we stop for a stroll at the jewel in the crown of the northwest Highland's Geopark - Knockan Crag. We arrive into Ullapool where you can spend the night exploring the beautiful harbour village. (Overnight: Ullapool)

DAY FIVE I On our way to the Isle of Skye, we pass the romantic Eilean Donan Castle, before crossing the Skye Bridge to our enchanting island destination. Your last stop of the day will be a visit to Kilt Rock with its impressive cascading waterfall. We spend the night in Portree, Isle of Skye's vibrant hub.

(Overnight: Portree)

DAY SIX I We have the chance to explore a wee bit more of the beautiful Isle of Skye before taking the ferry to the west coast fishing village of Mallaig. Here you can board the Jacobite Steam Train to Fort William. We then head along the west coast of Scotland to the quaint fishing town of Oban, where we will spend the next two nights.


